## HISTORIC HOUSES; BURIAL PLACES

(a) Birth places or one-time residences of distinguished Irishmen or other personalities.  
Location and description. Present owner or occupant. (b) Burial places of distinguished personalities.

The only house of historic interest is one which formerly occupied the site on which Lorrymore House now stands. The site is on the S.E. slope of Croaghman Mountain and is  $2\frac{1}{2}$  mls from Dooagh by road. On the site now occupied by Mayor Freyer's Guest House once stood a dwelling occupied by the infamous Captain Boycott. It was elsewhere in Mayo that the tenants of this landlord began the practice of Boycotting, ~~but that the British Government would not permit the tenants to do so~~. Nothing of the house now survives except a huge wooden beam, formerly a door lintel but now ~~is~~ incorporated in the chimney breast work in one of the Guest House lounges, where it may still be seen.

## SPAS OR MINERAL SPRINGS

There was a spa well (Chalybeate) formerly in use at Reel. It was situated beside the little track which leads past the side of the Anethyst Hotel to the beach and lies midway between ~~between~~ the Hotel and the beach. It is now dry and is remembered only by a very few of the older folk.
