(a) Mayo Abbey ruins - site of ancient college founded by St. Colman A.D. 668, who lived here for a time.

(a) St. Gerald, first Canonical Abbot of Mayo.

(b) St. Gerald died and was buried at Mayo A.D. 732.

(a) St. Adamnan, famous biographer + Abbot of Iona, visited Mayo three times; his last visit was in 703 the year before his death.

(a) (b) Lewis's tradition of Alfred the Great having been educated at Mayo and of one of his sons, a student, having been buried there.
